





These guidelines contain recommendations on the identification and management of substance use and substance use disorders for health care services which assist women who are pregnant, or have recently had a child, and who use alcohol or drugs or who have a substance use disorder.

International Consortium of Universities for Drug Demand Reduction (ICUDDR) The consortium aims to promote addiction science as a multidisciplinary field and encourage universities to develop addiction studies programs while integrating the UTC and UPC as primary academic resources. Member universities will collect training data on students for purposes of research, evaluation, and identification of best practices through the ISSUP website; and develop international academic exchange programs with faculty, students, interns and fellows.
